<u>Curators Corner</u> Steven Buckley, Curator NJSM

This is your museum and I want everyone to consider making contributions of artifacts relating to the history of Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts in New Jersey. If you know of a person or family that does not know what to do with their Scouting artifacts suggest to them that the NJSM might be the perfect place. The NJSM would like to assist anyone in any way we can to preserve their treasured items and perhaps donate them to our collection where they will be integrated into our current collection for the benefit of future generations of Scouting. We are an independent non profit organization. We are incorporated with the state of New Jersey. We have Federal 501-3-C status so people who make gifts can get a tax deduction.

I had told you in the spring of 2009 that our next big change at the museum was the task of removing from our museum all the items we had stored there that were currently not on display. By doing this we could recapture about 200 sq. feet of display space. Well that task is mostly done. We rented a large off site storage locker and filled it over last summer. With have started the process of

deciding on how to use our increased space for displaying more of the items we own.

In the museum we have five very old glass display cases that have a clear glass top and one shelf. We have known for some time that these have limited our ability to display things and that they also waste a lot of valuable floor space. In total they occupy 30 linear feet of space.

In late October I was notified by our past president Steve Lang that a local Hobby Shop, owned by a former scoutmaster, was relocating his business and that he would like to donate two 12 foot display cases. This unit has seven glass shelves on top and two wooden shelves below and a series of drawers down the middle. By replacing the old five units with this one we gain so much more display space it hard to imagine. In addition since we will not place them against

a wall we gain 24 feet of space on the back of the units for hanging pictures and flat objects.

considerable spent time September and October learning how to use our Past Perfect Museum management software package. I have finished adding to the Past Perfect data base all the photos that we had previously taken of gifts given to the Museum. We don't have pictures of many of early gifts given (2004 - 2007) but starting with 2008 forward we found that most gifts had been photographed and we now routinely take photos of gifts as they are received and enter those into the data base. The task of cataloging and photographing each individual object of each gift into one of the four specific Past Perfect data bases and then to provide suitable displays that would educate the public about Scouting is on going. These tasks have been greatly eased by the purchased of our new MAC computer that is set up to dual boot into either the MAC OS or Windows XP.

So far in 2009 we have received about 81 gifts. We are working with a potential giver in VA who has a collection of 150 boxes of items that we hope to bring to New Jersey before the end of 2010. The Museums Collection is growing all the time.

Shown on the next page are photos of your Curator Steven Buckley, one of our Operating Committee members Mary Engelmann who has been hired on a part basis by the NJSM to be what I would call our Assistant Curator and Randy Holden our Historian helping us by taking pictures. Mary will assist us with the enormous task of photographing and actually entering into our Past Perfect software the many thousands of items we currently have as part of our collection and future new items.







Please remember that the museum is open on most Wednesday evenings from mid September through mid June. If you are coming any distance at all I would ask you to call me in advance at 732-544-1131 / 732-809-7040 to confirm that the museum will be open to avoid any disappointments. Our docents are all volunteers and some nights we just can't find someone to be there. We can try and arrange visits at other times on request.

I encourage giving your Scouting Memorabilia to the NJ Scout Museum. I would be very happy to discuss Donations and Loans to our collection. Many people ask "What is needed by the Museum?" The answer simply stated is "Anything related to the Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts that will help tell the story of Scouting in New Jersey, and to a lesser extent scouting in general" is of interest to us.

Please consider how you might fit into our efforts it's a lot of work but also it's a lot of fun.
